WORLD CULTURAL GEOGRAPHY

Course #: 2103300

Grade Offered: 9

Course Length: One year

Prerequisite: Strongly recommended as a prerequisite for World History and for FCAT preparation

Students will develop multicultural understanding and use geographical concepts and skills to acquire information and systematically apply decision-making processes to real-life situations. They will acquire an understanding of interrelationships between people and their environment. The content will include the study of world cultural regions in terms of location, physical, characteristics, demographics, historical changes, economic activity, and land use.

WORLD RELIGIONS

Course #: 2105310

Grade Offered: 9, 10, 11, &12

Course Length: One year

Prerequisite: None

Through the study of world religions, students acquire an understanding of the way people in different cultures satisfy their spiritual needs. Students understand the place of religion in culture, the importance that has been attached to religion in peoples' lives and the relationship between religion and other social institutions.

PHILOSOPHY

Grade Offered: 9, 10, 11, &12

Course Length: One year

Prerequisite: None

Through the study of philosophy, students raise fundamental questions pertinent to all areas of human activity and inquiries, such as the meaning of life, religious and scientific thought, and the role of philosophy as being speculative and critical. Students use the study of philosophy to better understand and appreciate their culture and world.

AP EUROPEAN HISTORY

Course Length: One Year
